John Smythies (1) of Colchester, co. Essex, and Alpheton, co. Suffolk, born 28 October 1733; baptized at All Saints' Church, Colchester, 4 Dec. following; A.B. 1756, A.M. 1759 Sid. Sussex College, Cambridge, Rector of Alresford, near Colchester; succeeded his father as Rector of St. Mary Magdalene and Master of King James's Hospital, Colchester, 1773; Rector of Alpheton, co. Suffolk, in the gift of his own family, 1806, his elder brother Humphrey having died that year; also Rector of St. Nicholas, Colchester, for some years; died 15 October 1816 and buried in All Saints' Churchyard. Elizabeth, da. of Robert Longcroft of Fratton, co. Hants, Esq., and widow of James Powell; married Dec. 1777. Her mother was Elizabeth, da. of Edward Bearcroft of Mere Hall, co. Worcester, Esq. She died 30 Oct. 1816.

Francis Smythies (2), born 25 February and baptized 25 March 1735.

Francis Smythies (3), born 5 January 1736-7.

Robert Smythies (4), born 21 April 1738.

All died young.

Elizabeth (5), born 1 March and baptized at Holy Trinity Church, Colchester, 31 March 1739; married in January 1764 Rev. Thomas Twining, Rector of St. Mary's, Colchester, translator of Aristotle's "Poetics." Elizabeth and her husband are buried at St. Michael's, Mile End; she died in 1796 and he in 1804.

Elizabeth Mary (6), born 1779; married, 5 May 1802, Richard Twining of 15 Bedford Place and of the Strand, London, Esq., F.R.S., etc. She died 5 Jan. 1866 and is buried at Kensal Green Cemetery. Richard Twining died 12 Oct. 1857, leaving issue Richard, Louisa, and other children.

John Robert Smythies (7) of Lynch Court, co. Hereford, and Grey Friars' House, Colchester, born 21 October 1778 and baptized at St. Mary Magdalene's Church, Colchester; educated at Rugby School, A.B. 1801 Emmanuel College, Cambridge; succeeded his father as Rector of St. Mary Magdalene, Colchester, and Master of King James's Hospital; Private Chaplain to H.R.H. the Duke of Sussex; one of the Founders of the Royal Agricultural Society; died 24 March 1852, and was bur. in St. James's Churchyard, Colchester, on 1 April following. M.I.

Elizabeth, da. of George Kinnersley of Stepney, Middlesex, and sole heiress of James Kinnersley of Lynch Court, Eardisland, co. Hereford, Esq., her father's first-cousin; through this marriage the Lynch Court property came into the Smythies family; born 8 December and baptized 14 December 1783 at St. Anne's, Westminster; married at St. John's, Hampstead, in the co. of Middlesex, 11 November 1805; died 20 August 1852, and is buried with her husband in St. James's Churchyard, Colchester.
